A new beginning at our secondary school: Expectations and Aspirations

As the new year begins, we have raised our expectations and aspirations for the whole-school. 


EXAM RESULTS

IGCSE


Overall, 28% of all grades received were A* or A.

AS LEVEL


13% achieved the top A grade41% of all grades were a C or higher53% were awarded a D or higher.

Academic Performance Tracking

In line with the National Agenda 2021 of the UAE, all students in secondary will take a CAT 4 test. This is more than the required baseline assessment. At RAK Academy, we are also using it to calculate target grades for students. At multiple times during the year, students will be able to compare current progress against expected target performance and to identify improvements required. Target grades will be discussed with both parents and students as part of the ongoing academic feedback and mentoring process. Testing for this began last week.
